Pursuant to Rule 26.8 of the Rules of this Court, Petitioner Erik Hughes moves for leave to dispense with the requirement of a joint appendix in this case. The respondent agrees that a joint appendix is not necessary.

This case presents the question whether a prisoner who was convicted and sentenced pursuant to a plea agreement under Federal Rule of Criminal Procedure 11(c)(1)(C) is eligible for a reduced sentence under 18 U.S.C. § 3582(c)(2). The pertinent materials, including the opinion of the court of appeals, the defendant's motion for reduction of sentence, the district court's order denying the defendant's motion, the sentencing hearing transcript, and the guilty plea and plea agreement are included as appendices to the petition for a writ of certiorari. In our view, no other portion of the record would assist the Court's consideration of the case.
