Dear Mr. Bickell:

I am counsel for respondent in the above-referenced case. On July 24, 2018, a certiorari petition was docketed in this case. On September 14, 2018, the Court requested a response. Unless extended by the Court, the response would be due on October 15, 2018. For the reasons that follow, and pursuant to Rule 30.4, I respectfully request an extension of 30 days, to and including November 14, 2018.

I have several pressing obligations during these upcoming weeks, including consecutive preferential trial settings in two felony criminal cases on October 26 and November 2, with final pretrial settings during the week of October 1, 2018; and a petition for review due to be filed in the Texas Supreme Court on October 5, 2018. In addition, due to recent personnel changes in my office, I am securing assistance from qualified attorneys to insure Ms. Polk's effective response to the petition for writ of certiorari for the Court. An extension will allow me to meet these obligations and also to file a response that adequately addresses the points raised in the petition.

For these reasons, I ask that a 30-day extension be granted. Thank you for your attention to this matter.
