Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 30.4, Respondent Mary Gordon respectfully requests a 30-day extension of time to file a response to the petition for a writ of certiorari in the above-captioned matter to November 14, 2018. Ms. Gordon requests this extension because she only recently retained undersigned counsel to represent her *pro bono* before this Court and counsel has numerous filing deadlines which would otherwise prevent him from providing the sort of comprehensive analysis that would aid this Court in determining whether to grant certiorari.
