General Information

My name is JD Floyd. That is the name on my birth certificate and identification. My family call me JD. A lot of other people call me John Floyd. John Floyd is the name that was used when I was convicted.

My lawyer helped me fill out this form. I sent my lawyer my bank statements and pay stub so they could help me get it right. After we had filled out the form, the notary read it with me before I signed it.

Spousal Information (Questions 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8)

I found out I got married when I was 20. I did not know I was legally married until my lawyers found a certificate this year. I do not think I have seen the woman I am married to for over thirty years. I do not know how much money she has, but I do not think it is very much money.

Accommodation and Transport (Question 8)

I live in an RV. A woman gave the RV to Innocence Project New Orleans. Innocence Project New Orleans arranged for me to live in the RV after I got out of prison. The RV is on Mr. Charles Chatelain's land. Mr. Chatelain is my boss. I do not pay Innocence Project New Orleans any money to live in the RV. I do not pay Mr. Chatelain for the RV being on his land.

I do not own a car or truck. Mr. Chatelain lets me use one of his trucks. I pay for the gas for the truck when I use it on the weekend or to go see my family.

Other Information (Question 12)

I got out of prison on June 22, 2017. Before that, I was in prison for 36 ½ years. I did not have any money when I went to prison. When I was in prison, I could only work prison jobs and so could not save up money. The most money I made in prison was \$8 each week when I was trustee. I have worked since I got out of prison, but have only been out of prison for 1 year and 4 months. This is why I do not have very much money.
