<u>Descamps</u>. Petitioner's situation is the same as <u>Hill's</u>. He is relying on the same Supreme Court cases as <u>Hill</u> did. Petitioner was also sentenced in the same circuit as <u>Hill's</u> 2241 petition. Moreover, at the time of Petitioner's first 2255 motion, this Court had not issued its rulings in <u>Descamps</u> and <u>Mathis</u>. And the government has also conceded in numerous cases that <u>Descamps</u> and <u>Mathis</u> are retroactive. <u>See, eig.</u>, <u>Hill</u> at 595. There is no difference between <u>Hill's</u> case and Petitioner's case. Therefore, the government's argument is without merit.

CONCLUSION

The petition for a writ of certiorari should be granted. Alternatively, this Court should grant certiorari in this case and Wheeler and consolidate both cases for argument.
