considering the amount of people in prison in California and other states, there is a need for this court to look a little deeper into cases such as petitioner's.

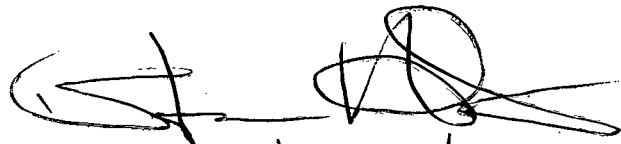
Petitioner's writ can be of great national importance for those litigants that have to rely on the Fourteenth Amendment.
