I researched, prepared and filed on September 10, 2018 a Motion for Reconsideration in State of *South Carolina v. George Cleveland, III, criminal case no. 2012-GS-23-07504*; Appealing the 90-day jail sentence for falling behind on Restitution. Exhibits 1-2;

I researched and argued my Interlocutory Appeal on August 27, 2018 at the Oconee County, S.C. Courthouse; *George Cleveland, III v. Walhalla Municipal Court, c/a no. 2016-CP-37-00512* claiming the Walhalla Police Department is withholding exculpatory evidence in a Solicitation of a Bail bondsman charge I have pending in the Walhalla, S.C. I also work 60 plus hours a week, and I'm in College part-time. Exhibit 4 at par. 1. My legal case, work schedule, and school work all prevented me from researching, preparing, and filing my Certiorari Petition in this case prior to the **September 24, 2018 deadline²**.


