## MOTION FOR LEAVE TO PROCEED *IN FORMA PAUPERIS*

COMES NOW the Petitioner, Curtis Huling; and, pursuant to Sup. Ct. Rule 39, moves for leave to proceed *in forma pauperis*.

1) United States District Court Magistrate Judge Stephen Hyles determined Mr. Huling was indigent on September 6, 2016, and appointed the Federal Defenders of the Middle District of Georgia, Inc., to represent Mr. Huling. The Federal Defenders of the Middle District Georgia, Inc. also represented Mr. Huling before the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit.

2) Mr. Huling remains indigent and wishes to pursue a writ of *certiorari* from this Court to the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit, which affirmed the District Court's sentence imposed in Mr. Huling's case on July 10, 2018.

3) As the District Court for the Middle District of Georgia and the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit appointed counsel for Mr. Huling, an indigent party, no affidavit or declaration by Mr. Huling is required pursuant to Sup. Ct. Rule 39(1).

WHEREFORE, Petitioner asks this Court to grant his motion and allow him to proceed *in forma pauperis*.
