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Petitioner contends (Pet. 5-6) that the definition of a “crime of violence” in 18 U.S.C. 924(c) (3) (B) is unconstitutionally vague and that his conviction under 18 U.S.C. 924(c) for using a firearm during and in relation to a conspiracy to commit Hobbs Act robbery should therefore be vacated. This Court has granted review in United States v. Davis, No. 18-431 (Jan. 4, 2019), to address the same issue. The petition for a writ of certiorari should therefore

be held pending the decision in Davis and then disposed of as appropriate in light of that decision.*
