APPLICATION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE PETITION
FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI TO THE UNITED STATES COURT OF
APPEALS FOR THE FEDERAL CIRCUIT

To the Honorable John G. Roberts, Jr., Chief Justice for the United States:

Petitioner Pamela Melvin hereby moves this Court, pursuant to Rules 13(5) and 30, for an extension of time of 60 days, to and including April 12, 2018, to file a petition for a writ of certiorari for a review of the decision entered on November 13, 2017, by the United States Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit in case no. 17-2041 as evidenced by the copy of the entered mandate attached hereto as **Exhibit 1**.

The jurisdiction of this Court is based on 28 U.S.C. § 1254(1). This

application is being mailed by certified mail on January 31, 2017, which is about 10 days prior to that due. The date within which a petition for writ of certiorari would be due, if not extended, is February 11, 2018.

Reasons the extension of time is needed
