

ORDER

This matter is before the panel of Randolph, P.J., Beam and Chamberlin, JJ., on the Petition for Extraordinary Writ Seeking Collateral Relief filed pro se by Senica Matthew Franklin. The filing is in the nature of a petition for post-conviction relief and is considered as such. Franklin's conviction became final in 2010. The current petition is subject to the time bar. Miss. Code Ann. § 99-39-5. Further, Franklin's prior petition for post-conviction relief was denied. The present filing is subject to the successive writ bar. Miss. Code Ann. 99-39-27. Franklin claims to present newly discovered evidence which exempts him from the procedural bars. After due consideration, the panel finds that Franklin's new evidence primarily relates to unsworn documents from 2012 and that Franklin has not shown that he is entitled to the relief sought. The panel finds that the relief sought in the petition is denied.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the Petition for Extraordinary Writ Seeking Collateral Relief filed pro se by Senica Matthew Franklin is denied.
