Dear Ms. Nesbitt:

I am in receipt of your letter dated January 2, 2019 (a copy of which is attached hereto), wherein you state that you received my petition for writ of certiorari. In response to same, enclosed please find the corrected and/or updated documents that you requested of me which are also now signed by me. My apologies for overlooking these errors. It would seem that I mistakenly sent the Court the draft copies of what I had intended on filing. This oversight was no doubt due to me being moved unexpectedly and suddenly from the West Side Compound at Fort Dix to the East Side Compound with only a few hours prior notice to me.

On that note, I wanted to advise the Court that although your letter states that my petition "was postmarked November 16, 2018 and received December 18, 2018", the reality is that I mailed said packet (or at least recall mailing said packet) on the evening of November 7, 2018 after receiving notice that I was being transferred to the East Side within hours.

Accordingly, the record should reflect that the petition was placed in an Institutional Mailbox (the only mail receptacle available to inmates in that unit) on November 7, 2018. As to the fact that the Court did not receive said petition until December 18, 2018 (as your letter states), all I can say is that the mail here at FCI Fort Dix is notoriously and infamously delayed. Unfortunately, that is a situation beyond my control, despite my own and other inmates best efforts at filing grievances against the administration here in an effort to have the mail situation remedied.

That having been said, it is respectfully requested that my petition for writ of certiorari be granted. As per your instructions "no change to the substance of the petition" was made. Should the Court require any further information and/or have any questions, I may be reached via U.S. Mail (although delayed) at the above listed address. Thank you for your time, consideration, and understanding.
