THE GRAND JURY CHARGES THAT:

COUNT ONE

(Felon in Possession of a Weapon)

On or about September 24, 2004, in the Galveston Division of the Southern District of Texas, the defendant,

**ANDRE DAVID LEFFEBRE,
a/k/a Charlie Kerr,**

having been convicted in a court of three violent felonies, all of which are crimes punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year, did knowingly possess in and affecting commerce a firearm, namely a Springfield Armory, model XD-40, .40 caliber pistol, which had been shipped and transported in interstate and foreign commerce.



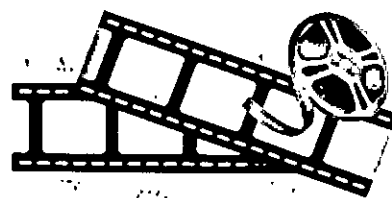
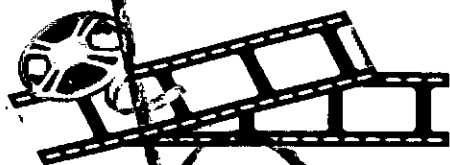

Mr. Leffebvre:

I received your letter regarding your case and the impact on it of the Supreme Court's recent decision in Johnson. Mr. Berg no longer works for our office, so I am responding instead.

It appears that our office withdrew from your case prior to sentencing, so our file does not have enough information for me to say whether you are likely to win on a § 2255 motion, but if counsel were appointed to your case, they would certainly investigate that issue on your behalf.

From a review of the docket in your case, it appears that on October 19, 2016, the Fifth Circuit granted you authorization to file a successive § 2255 motion. I can also see that you previously asked the Court to appoint you counsel, back in August, and that motion was denied. You might consider once again asking the Court to appoint you counsel now that you have the Fifth Circuit's authorization to file your § 2255 motion.

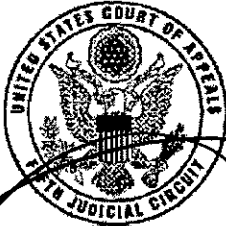

IDENTIFYING INFORMATION

Mr. Leffebre is a 53-year-old (DOB 02/13/1962) white male, currently serving a 399-month federal sentence for Bank Robbery, Brandishing a Firearm During and in Relation to a Crime of Violence, and Felon in Possession of a Firearm. He entered the custody of the Federal Bureau of Prisons (BOP) on January 11, 2005, following the revocation of supervised release. On July 2, 2007, while at the Beaumont County Court House in Beaumont, Texas and awaiting sentencing for his index offense, he allegedly attempted to escape from custody (to date no formal charges have been lodged against Mr. Leffebre). Specifically, Mr. Leffebre used paper, tape, and batteries to construct an object that resembled a loaded firearm. He then utilized this false weapon to take a correctional officer and three inmates hostage in an attempt to escape custody. This resulted in the activation of institution lockdown procedures and the notification of local law enforcement's hostage negotiation team. Negotiation tactics were employed until Mr. Leffebre released his hostages, destroyed the false weapon, and surrendered to authorities (approximately 30 minutes later). He was transferred to the United States Penitentiary Administrative Maximum Facility in Florence, Colorado (ADX) on March 21, 2008 where he was housed there until January 13, 2014, secondary to completion of a 770 transfer form (Medical/ Surgical and Psychiatric Referral Request) and transfer to the United States Medical Center for Federal Prisoners in Springfield, Missouri (USMCFP Springfield). Mr. Leffebre was transferred to the United States Penitentiary in Atlanta, Georgia (USP Atlanta) on October 28, 2014, from USMCFP Springfield for participation in the Secure Mental Health Step Down Program (SMH-SDP).

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Social Skills

Strengths: Mr. Leffebvre has demonstrated the ability to greet others as well as initiating and terminating conversations in an appropriate manner. He is able to moderately accept feedback from staff and peers. Mr. Leffebvre has also acted as his own advocate in relation to expressing his thoughts regarding perceived social injustices.

Areas for Growth: Mr. Leffebvre struggles with not interrupting others during conversations as well as continuing conversations when others voice opinions in opposition to his. Mr. Leffebvre has also evidenced difficulty with connecting to staff and being seen as overly litigious and verbally confrontational.


TREATMENT RECOMMENDATIONS

While in the SMH-SDP, Mr. Leffebvre will receive individual and group therapy primarily focused on interpersonal skills development, advancement in emotion regulation skills, and decreasing criminogenic beliefs. Mr. Leffebvre would benefit from increased awareness and understanding about mental illnesses and their associated stigmas. Further, treatment should help Mr. Leffebvre identify ways in which his belief system has interfered with some of his long-term goals for living. Mr. Leffebvre would also benefit from treatment targeting illicit substance use and making positive lifestyle changes. The integration of the concept of mindfulness with an arena in which learned skills could be practiced, discussed and refined would also be beneficial. Given that the SMH-SDP operates in the context of a uniquely modified therapeutic community, Mr. Leffebvre will also be afforded the opportunity to practice skills and engage other program participants throughout each day. Treatment providers should encourage Mr. Leffebvre to be open-minded about the potential benefits of pharmacological treatment

Clinicians should remain cognizant of the increased likelihood for resistance to treatment secondary to Mr. Leffebvre's diagnoses and belief system. Given both his diagnosis of Delusional Disorder and Antisocial Personality Disorder, he will likely need clear evidence that treatment benefits him and his future.
