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## IMPRISONMENT

The defendant is hereby committed to the custody of the United States Bureau of Prisons to be imprisoned for a total term of **60 months**.

This sentence consists of a term of 60 months on Count One and Count Three of the Information, and a term of 3 months on Count Four of the Information, all to be served concurrently, for a total term of 60 months.

- The court makes the following recommendations to the Bureau of Prisons:
- The defendant is remanded to the custody of the United States Marshal.
- The defendant shall surrender to the United States Marshal for this district:
  - at 12:00 noon. on 12/1/2017
  - as notified by the United States Marshal.
- The defendant shall surrender for service of sentence at the institution designated by the Bureau of Prisons:
  - before 2 p.m. on .
  - as notified by the United States Marshal.
  - as notified by the Probation or Pretrial Services Office.

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## SUPERVISED RELEASE

Upon release from imprisonment, the defendant shall be on supervised release for a term of 3 years on Counts One and Three, to run concurrently. No term of supervised release is imposed on Count Four.

The defendant shall report to the probation office in the district to which the defendant is released within 72 hours of release from the custody of the Bureau of Prisons.

The defendant shall not commit another federal, state, or local crime.

The defendant shall not illegally possess a controlled substance. The defendant shall refrain from any unlawful use of a controlled substance. The defendant shall submit to one drug test within 15 days of release from imprisonment and at least two periodic drug tests thereafter, as determined by the court.

- The above drug testing condition is suspended, based on the court's determination that the defendant poses a low risk of future substance abuse. (Check, if applicable.)
- The defendant shall not possess a firearm, ammunition, destructive device, or any other dangerous weapon. (Check, if applicable.)
- The defendant shall cooperate in the collection of DNA as directed by the probation officer. (Check, if applicable.)
- The defendant shall register with the state sex offender registration agency in the state where the defendant resides, works, or is a student, as directed by the probation officer. (Check, if applicable.)
- The defendant shall participate in an approved program for domestic violence. (Check, if applicable.)

If this judgment imposes a fine or a restitution obligation, it shall be a condition of supervised release that the defendant pay any such fine or restitution that remains unpaid at the commencement of the term of supervised release in accordance with the Schedule of Payments set forth in the Criminal Monetary Penalties sheet of this judgment.

The defendant shall comply with the standard conditions that have been adopted by this court (set forth below). The defendant shall also comply with the additional conditions on the attached page.

## STANDARD CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION

1. The defendant shall not leave the judicial district or other specified geographic area without the permission of the Court or probation officer;
2. The defendant shall report to the probation officer in a manner and frequency directed by the Court or probation office;
3. The defendant shall answer truthfully all inquiries by the probation officer and follow the instructions of the probation officer;
4. The defendant shall support his/her dependents and meet other family responsibilities;
5. The defendant shall work regularly at a lawful occupation unless excused by the probation officer for schooling, training, or other acceptable reasons;
6. The defendant shall notify the probation officer at least ten days prior to any change in residence or employment;
7. The defendant shall refrain from excessive use of alcohol and shall not purchase, possess, use, distribute, or administer any narcotic or other controlled substance, or any paraphernalia related to such substances, except as prescribed by a physician;
8. The defendant shall not frequent places where controlled substances are illegally sold, used, distributed, or administered, or other places specified by the Court;
9. The defendant shall not associate with any persons engaged in criminal activity and shall not associate with any person convicted of a felony unless granted permission to do so by the probation officer;
10. The defendant shall permit a probation officer to visit at any time at home or elsewhere and shall permit confiscation of any contraband observed in plain view by the probation officer;
11. The defendant shall notify the probation officer within 72 hours of being arrested or questioned by a law enforcement officer;
12. The defendant shall not enter into any agreement to act as an informer or a special agent of a law enforcement agency without the permission of the Court;
13. As directed by the probation officer, the defendant shall notify third parties of risks that may be occasioned by his/her criminal record or personal history of characteristics and shall permit the probation officer to make such notification and to confirm the defendant's compliance with such notification requirement.

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### **SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION**

1. The defendant shall pay any financial penalty that is imposed by this judgment and that remains unpaid at the commencement of the term of supervised release.
2. The defendant shall provide the probation officer with access to any requested financial information.
3. The defendant shall not incur new credit charges on existing accounts or apply for additional lines of credit without permission of the probation officer until the restitution has been paid in full. In addition, the defendant shall not enter into any contractual agreements which obligate funds without the permission of the probation officer.

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## CRIMINAL MONETARY PENALTIES

The defendant shall pay the following total criminal monetary penalties in accordance with the schedule of payments set forth on Sheet 6. The assessment is ordered in accordance with 18 U.S.C. 3013.

It is further ordered that the defendant shall make restitution to the victims as included in the Judgment and Commitment Order in the amount of \$4,942,070.18, except that no further payment shall be required after the sum of the amounts actually paid by both defendants has fully covered all of the compensable injuries. Any payment made by the defendant shall be divided among the persons named in proportion to their compensable injuries. Additionally, the defendant is ordered to make restitution in the amount of \$354,251.58, payable to the Internal Revenue Service. During the period of incarceration, payment shall be made as follows: (1) if the defendant earns wages in a Federal Prison Industries (UNICOR) job, then the defendant must pay a minimum of 50 percent of wages earned toward the financial obligations imposed by this Order; (2) if the defendant does not work in a UNICOR job, then the defendant must pay a minimum of \$25 per quarter toward the financial obligations imposed in this Order. These payments made while incarcerated do not preclude the government from using other assets or income of the defendant to satisfy his restitution obligation. Upon release from incarceration, the defendant shall pay restitution at the minimum rate of 10 percent of monthly gross income until such time as the Court may alter that payment schedule in the interests of justice. The government may enforce the full amount of restitution ordered at any time, pursuant to Title 18 U.S.C. §§ 3612, 3613, and 3664(m).

Unless the court has expressly ordered otherwise, if the judgment imposes imprisonment, payment of criminal monetary penalties is due during imprisonment. Unless otherwise directed by the court, the probation officer, or the United States attorney, all criminal monetary penalties except those payments made through the Federal Bureau of Prisons' Inmate Financial Responsibility Program, shall be made to **U.S. District Court, 900 Georgia Avenue, Suite 309, Chattanooga, TN 37402**. Payments shall be in the form of a check or a money order, made payable to U.S. District Court, with a notation of the case number including defendant number.

The defendant shall receive credit for all payments previously made toward any criminal monetary penalties imposed.
