Dear Mr. Harris:

We represent respondents Amazon.com Services, Inc. (“ASI”), Parcel Shippers Association, and National Association of Letter Carriers, AFL-CIO (collectively, “Intervenor Respondents”) in the above-referenced petition for certiorari. As intervenors in the proceedings below, Intervenor Respondents are entitled to file a response to the petition pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 12.6. A response is currently due on February 4, 2019. We respectfully request that the time to file a response be extended by 30 days, to and including March 6, 2019.

The extension is warranted because the attorneys responsible for preparing the response for Intervenor Respondents—including the new counsel of record for ASI, Neal Katyal—have upcoming filings and arguments in several other matters that will require their attention over the next several weeks. Among other matters, Mr. Katyal expects to present oral argument in the *United Healthcare of New York, Inc. v. Vullo*, No. 18-2583 (2d Cir.) on February 8, and is scheduled to file a merits reply brief in *Maryland-National Capitol Park & Planning Commission v. American Humanist Association*, No. 18-18, in mid-February, and a petition for certiorari in *McKinney v. Arizona* by February 21. See No. 18A580. Given these commitments, an extension of time is warranted to permit counsel to prepare a response that fully analyzes and responds to the arguments raised in the petition for certiorari.
