Please take note of this humbly request pursuant to Sup. Ct. 30.2, for a 60 day extension of time to file a Writ of Certiorari at this court from the United States Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit's most recent denial of Butler's Rehearing and/or Rehearing En Banc, February 14, 2018.

The prison's litigators have suffered severely because of either the complete closure or limited access to the Education Department

Since I desire to be efficient, effective and punctual when offering My Writ Of Certiorari at this Court, a 60 day extension of time should be fully considered.
