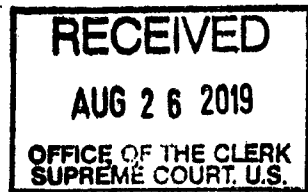

Request for Reconsideration

The Judiciary Act of 1925 conflicts with the Constitution because this Act allows the lower courts to routinely deny constitutional rights because the lower courts are granted the power to defy rulings established by the Supreme Court. The Constitution did not grant this authority to the inferior courts. The Judiciary Act allows lower court to issue conflicting ruling from the same court and the same judges resulting in a biased and unjust court system that promote outright violation of the 5th Amendment by refusing to apply fairness and laws in reaching court decisions.

I am also asking this court to accept an amicus curiae brief from the Federal Trade Commission to present pleadings on my behalf. If the courts are limiting the protections and the enforcement of laws passed by Congress and granted to the Federal Trade Commission, then consumers and the Federal Trade Commission needs to be aware of what laws and protections the courts will not enforce.



I present this request for reconsideration in good faith and not for delay.
