Appellant's Application For An

Extension Of Time To File

The Petition For A Writ Of

Certiorari

Defendant/Appellant, William Earl Miller, Sr. (hereinafter, "Miller")
 in propria persona pursuant Rule 13.5 of the Rules of the Supreme
 Court of the United States hereby respectfully ask this Honorable
 Court for the sixty (60) day extension of time to file the petition
 for a writ of certiorari.

1 The basis for jurisdiction in this Court is set forth in Rule
2 10(c) of the Rules of the Supreme Court of the United
3 States where the Arizona Supreme Court decided the
4 question of whether the lack of subject-matter jurisdiction
5 violated due process under the Fifth and Fourteenth
6 Amendments of the United States Constitution in a way
7 that conflicts with relevant decisions of this Court. See
8 the Arizona Supreme Court's Order on January 8, 2019
9 denying Miller's Petition for Review attached hereto at
10 Exhibit 1.

12 The aforementioned Order from the Arizona Supreme
13 Court followed the Opinion on August 16, 2018 by the
14 Arizona Court of Appeals, Division One attached hereto
15 at Exhibit 2.

17 After a bench trial the Maricopa County Superior
18 Court in the State of Arizona determined that the State
19 did not prove Miller's property was subject to forfeiture
20 in rem but, that he is personally (in personam) liable to
21 the State in the amount of \$482,400 for racketeering in its
22 Judgment entered on April 7, 2017.

23
24 The specific reasons why extension of time is justified
25 are that Miller's projected release date from prison is on
26 April 29, 2019, which is eleven (11) days after the petitions
27 due date on April 18, 2019, and the extension of time
28 to file the petition after his release will provide

1 Miller with an opportunity for the necessary resources and will
2 finally allow him access to the Courts. See Miller's Arizona
3 Department of Corrections' Inmate Time Computation attached
4 hereto at Exhibit 3.
