ORDER

On April 22, 2019, a document titled “Petition of Law/Rehearing” was filed in this Court by “CATHRIN FUNK-VAUGHN AKA REBECCA ANNETTE MCNIEL, JOHN WESLEY VAUGHN, RONALD MARTIN KOEHLER AND KEVIN LEWIS JOHNSON.” The document seeks rehearing of a decision of the Court of Appeals issued in Case No. M2009-00411-COA-R3-PT, that was filed on November 18, 2009. The time for seeking rehearing of the Court of Appeals’ 2009 decision expired long ago. Tenn. R. App. P. 39(b) (“A petition for rehearing must be filed with the clerk of the appellate court within 10 days after entry of judgment unless on motion the time is shortened or enlarged by the court or a judge thereof.”). No application for permission to appeal was filed in this Court, and the time for filing an application for permission to appeal in this Court seeking review of the Court of Appeals’ decision also expired long ago. Tenn. R. App. P. 11 (“The application for permission to appeal shall be filed with the clerk of the Supreme Court within 60 days after the entry of the judgment of the Court of Appeals . . .”). Accordingly, the “Petition of Law/Rehearing” is dismissed as untimely. Costs associated with this matter are taxed to the movants.
