- (h) Article 26 (Right to freedom of conscience and the free profession and practice of religion): This article guarantees the right to freedom of conscience and the free profession and practice of religion to all citizens.
- (i) Article 28 (Right to freedom of movement and residence): This article guarantees the right to freedom of movement and residence to all citizens.
- (j) Article 30 (Right to freedom of trade, occupation, and profession): This article guarantees the right to freedom of trade, occupation, and profession to all citizens.
- (k) Article 31 (Right to freedom of movement and residence): This article guarantees the right to freedom of movement and residence to all citizens.
- (l) Article 32 (Right to freedom of movement and residence): This article guarantees the right to freedom of movement and residence to all citizens.
- (m) Article 33 (Right to freedom of movement and residence): This article guarantees the right to freedom of movement and residence to all citizens.
