

MR. TAYLOR'S MOTION REQUESTING A 60-DAY EXTENSION OF TIME
IN ORDER TO FILE HIS PETITION FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI

The United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit denied Mr. Taylor's motion for reconsideration of his appeal. The date of this denial was January 7, 2019. Mr. Taylor wishes to file a petition for writ of certiorari, and is doing so as an incarcerated and pro se litigant. As such, he must overcome the many obstacles associated with prison life when preparing his legal filings, and requests an additional 60 days to file his petition with this Court.


Mr. Taylor is incarcerated in federal prison at FCI Coleman Low in Coleman, Florida. This prison is subject to daily recalls and lockdowns for many different reasons, to include weather, staff shortages, staff training, staff parties, census counts, institutional counts, shakedowns,



fights, security breaches, as well as many other reasons that inmates are never informed about. These issues all prevent or limit access to the education department, where the 1 copy machine (available for 30 minutes, 3 times a day, 4 days a week), the 6 functional non-memory typewriters, and the 12 law library computers are housed and shared by the over 2,000 men housed here. These resources are required for Mr. Taylor to prepare his filing for this Court.

Therefore, Mr. Taylor respectfully requests for a 60-day extension of time in order to overcome these known and unknown obstacles that prevent an otherwise earlier filing of his petition with this Court.




