MOTION FOR LEAVE TO PROCEED *IN FORMA PAUPERIS*

COMES NOW the Petitioner, Erickson Meko Campbell; and, pursuant to Sup. Ct. Rule 39, moves for leave to proceed *in forma pauperis*.

1) United States District Court Magistrate Judge Charles H. Weigle determined Mr. Campbell was indigent on October 1, 2014, and appointed the Federal Defenders of the Middle District of Georgia, Inc., to represent Mr. Campbell under the provisions of 18 U.S.C. § 3006A. The Federal Defenders of the Middle District Georgia, Inc. also represented Mr. Campbell before the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit.


2) Mr. Campbell remains indigent and wishes to pursue a writ of *certiorari* from this Court to the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit, which affirmed, in a published opinion, Mr. Campbell conviction and sentence on January 8, 2019.

3) As the District Court for the Middle District of Georgia and the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit appointed counsel for Mr. Campbell, an indigent party, no affidavit or declaration by Mr. Campbell is required pursuant to Sup. Ct. Rule 39(1).

WHEREFORE, Mr. Campbell, through undersigned counsel, request that this Honorable Court allow him to proceed *in forma pauperis* and that the Office of the Federal Defenders of the Middle District of Georgia, Inc. continue to represent him.
