
MOTION TO EXTEND TIME TO FILE

JURISDICTION

The U.S. Court of Appeals denied Certificate of Appealability on February 12, 2019. Case no. 18-1393¹. The petitioner has until on or around May 12, 2019 to file on Petition for Review on Certiorari. The jurisdiction of this court is invoked under 28 U.S.C. 1254(1).

The Petitioner, Ivan Stamps, proceeding pro se, humbly moves this Honorable Court for an Extension of Time to file a Petition for Review on Certiorari.

The Petitioner is currently a prisoner in the Colorado Department of Corrections, and has experienced limited law library time, and resources.

The facility has been experiencing many unscheduled lockdowns, and frequent events that have caused the closing of the law library causing the petitioner to fall behind in his research and proper formatting of his pleading pursuant to the rules of this court.

The petitioner has issues not limited to but includes the allegations that (1) his conviction was obtained though the prosecutions known use of fraudulent/perjured testimony, (2) whether his claim of Outrageous Governmental Conduct may carry a custody simpliciter under the Fourteenth Amendment. The petitioner believes these issues may promote the advancement of law in this area
