
**MR. ALEMAN'S MOTION REQUESTING AN ADDITIONAL 60 DAYS
TO FILE HIS PETITION FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI**

Mr. Aleman received the Eleventh Circuit's denial of his appeal dated March 20, 2019. As such, Mr. Aleman had 90 days in order to file for writ of certiorari with the Supreme Court and is preparing to do so at this time. However, Mr. Aleman is proceeding as a pro se and incarcerated person and he must overcome the many obstacles associated with prison life while preparing his filing for this Court. Therefore, Mr. Aleman is requesting an additional 60 days to do so and properly file his petition for writ of certiorari.

Mr. Aleman is currently incarcerated at FCI Coleman Low federal prison in Coleman, Florida. This prison is subject to numerous recall and lockdown situations due to staff shortages, staff training, staff parties, weather, census counts, institutional counts, shakedowns, cutting of the grass, fights,

security breaches, and many other things that inmates are never informed about. All of these combine to limit inmates from accessing the education department where the 1 copy machine (available for 30 minutes, 3 times each day, 4 days a week), the 6 non-memory typewriters that have functional power cords, and the 12 law library computers are housed and shared by the over 2,000 inmates housed here. Limited access to these resources prevent Mr. Aleman from filing an otherwise earlier petition with this Court, and he respectfully requests an additional 60 days to overcome these obstacles and properly file his petition with this Court.
