Dear Justice Thomas:

I represent Montye Benjamin, the administratrix of the Estate of her late son, Jayvis Ledell Benjamin, in the above-entitled action. On March 13, 2019, the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit affirmed an order of the United States District Court for the Northern District of Georgia granting summary judgment in favor of the Defendant-Appellee and dismissing this civil rights action for the wrongful death of Jayvis Ledell Benjamin.

The petition in this Court is due on or before July 11, 2019. I write to respectfully request an additional 30 days to file the petition for a writ of certiorari to August 12, 2019. I make this request because I recently received a call from a representative of the Roderick and Solange MacArthur Justice Center, Bluhm Legal Clinic at Northwestern University School of Law. The organization has expressed interest in assisting my client with this petition for certiorari, and is able to pay the costs of filing and printing, as well as providing legal assistance. Because my client is indigent, this would be extremely valuable to her. I am also currently representing her pro bono in this petition, and it would assist me greatly.

However, the Justice Center has advised that it cannot assist with the current deadline for the certiorari petition. For this reason, I respectfully request an additional extension of time.


