



Dear Clerk of Court and Justices,

1. Plaintiffs respectfully motion or request a sixty days (60) extension of time to file a petition for certiorari in the above entitled case.
2. On August 30, 2018, the Eighth Circuit Court of Appeals issued its decision and judgment in this matter. See Exhibit 1.
3. Thus, Plaintiffs have until November 30, 2018 to file a petition for Certiorari with this Court to review the Judgment of the Eighth Circuit Court of Appeals in this matter.
4. This Court has jurisdiction to review the Judgment of the Eighth Circuit Court of Appeals in this matter.
5. Plaintiffs are pro se in this civil action and have been diligently working on their petition for certiorari but need more time to complete the petition due to then circumstances.
6. On August 01, 2018, Plaintiff, Emem Udoh, was scheduled for an evidentiary hearing in his state post-conviction matter on October 11, 2018.
7. Plaintiff, Emem Udoh, has been diligently preparing for his hearing but this evidentiary hearing was continued to October 18, 2018.
8. On October 18, 2018, Honorable Judge Tamara Garcia ordered Plaintiff, Emem Udoh, to submit a state court brief regarding his post-conviction matter by November 16, 2018.
9. This leaves Plaintiffs about 12 days to complete their petition. This is insufficient time to adequately research, prepare and mail their petition for certiorari to this Court. For good cause, Plaintiffs request a sixty days (60) extension of time to file their petition for certiorari by January 30, 2019. Both Plaintiffs consent to this extension request.
