Petitioner, Christopher Stegawski, is asking for leave to expand initial petition to include application of federal law to treatment of chronic pain. Case of United States v. Moore (1975) applies to use of methadone in treatment of addiction, whereas instant case involves treatment of chronic pain with medications that did not exist in 1975.

Lack of adversarial testing of most of issues raised by prosecutors resulted in need to cover legal and medical basis. Assumption that every physician is fueling epidemic is a reason for vindictive prosecution. Issues like ineffective assistance of counsels, medical expert errors will have to be left for successive petitions.

Petitioner had very good results of patients care and unusual findings that will be important in reversing current opioid crisis.

It is in interest of Justice and health and lives of patients to grant expansion.
