**APPLICATION FOR A 30-DAY EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE A PETITION
FOR A WRIT OF CERTIORARI FROM THE JUDGMENT OF THE

Petitioner, Bobby Martin, respectfully requests a 30-day extension of time, to and including May 9, 2019, within which to file a petition for a writ of certiorari from the judgment of the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit. Mr. Martin has not previously sought an extension of time from this Court.

Petitioner is filing this Application at least ten days before the filing date, which is April 9, 2019. *See* S.Ct. R. 13.5. The jurisdiction of this Court will be invoked under 28 U.S.C. § 1254(1).

to appeal the denial of his authorized second 28 U.S.C. § 2255 motion to vacate, set aside, or correct sentence.

Undersigned counsel believes that additional time will be important for the effective representation of Mr. Martin. No party will be prejudiced by the granting of a 30-day extension.

Accordingly, Petitioner respectfully requests that an order be entered extending the time to file a petition for writ of certiorari by thirty days, to and including May 9, 2019.
