of Certiorari Past Deadline (Rule 13.5)

I Kenneth R Barber hereby moves this court for leave to file Writ of Certiorari pursuant to Rule 13(5) on the grounds that the circumstances concerning the missed deadline are extraordinary which left it impossible for me to make copies serve and file writ by the courts set deadline of Sept 17, 2018. (See: letters from Clerk, Ex. A, Motions, Ex. B)

I Kenneth R Barber declare under penalty of perjury that the following supporting facts are true:

- 1) I am a lay-person in law.
- 2) An application for an extension of time was presented to the Chief Justice who on Aug 8, 2018 extended the time to and including Sept 17, 2018.
- 3) On Sept. 17, 2018 I was suppose to go to the law library to make copies so I could serve and file the writ. The Librarian didn't show up for work. Therefore it was impossible for me to make the deadline.
- 4) On Sept 17, 2018 I sent a motion to this court requesting an extension up to Sept 24, 2018. (See Ex A, Ex B)
- 5) On Sept 21, 2018 an incident happened on the yard

which resulted in me being sent to hole and all my property & papers work confiscated. On sept 24, 2018 I filed another motion for extension of time but once again had no access to copies and therefore could not serve documents. I also didn't have Zip Code. (The motion was returned)

8) I believe the court does have the power pursuant to Rule 13(s) if the court rules I missed the deadline due to extraordinary circumstances.

9) I have set forth extraordinary and complex set of valid issues which will undoubtedly effect countless prisoners and finally set a new precedent of clearly established federal law.

1) Grant this motion to file the included writ of Certiorari Past deadline,

2) Grant any such other and further relief this Court deems appropriate.
