

Dear Mr. Harris:

As counsel of record for respondent Enigma Software Group USA, LLC ("Enigma"), in the above-captioned case, I am writing to request a 45-day extension of time to file a brief in opposition in this case to and including July 27, 2020. The certiorari petition was filed on May 11, 2020, and it was docketed on May 13, 2020. Without the requested extension, the brief in opposition would be due on June 12, 2020.

The requested 45-day extension to file a brief in opposition to the certiorari petition is necessary in order to allow counsel adequate time to review the petition and prepare a response given the professional disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic and the press of other business for which undersigned counsel has primary responsibility.
