## REASONS FOR EXTENSION

Ms. Morin respectfully requests under Rule 13, an extension of no more than 60 days within which to file a Petition for a Writ of Certiorari. Ms. Morin has been diligently pursuing this matter through the Montana Supreme Court, Montana Federal District Court and the Ninth Circuit while attempting to protect and provide for her clients, most importantly finding representation for her clients. Ms. Morin recently completed a response and appearance before the Ninth Circuit regarding this matter and has had to devote the bulk of her time to that process making it very difficult to prepare this Petition. Additionally, Ms. Morin has been forced to close her office because of this unconstitutional action by the Montana Supreme Court again, making it very difficult for her to respond and move forward with this Petition.

The grave injustices which exist in this matter will continue should Ms. Morin not be allowed to proceed. An incapacitated, elderly woman will remain completely bereft of her Constitutional Rights. Likewise, Ms. Morin's due process

rights and equal protection rights will continue to be infringed, impacting all of her clients; good people who deserve and are entitled to representation. Ms. Morin respectfully requests a 60 day extension within which to file a Petition for a Writ of Certiorari in this matter.
