**ORDER ON MOTION TO
RECONSIDER, MOTION
FOR FINDINGS OF FACTS,
AND MOTION TO STAY
THE MANDATE**

G.D.P. has filed a motion to reconsider the Court's decision dated June 6, 2019, a motion for findings of facts, and a motion to stay the mandate. The motions have been reviewed by the panel that decided the original appeal.

The Supreme Judicial Court, sitting as the Law Court, reviewed this matter as an appellate court and not as a fact-finder. Therefore, this Court lacks authority to enter findings of facts as requested.

It is ORDERED as follows:

- The motion to reconsider is DENIED
- The motion to stay the mandate is DENIED
- The motion for findings of facts is DISMISSED for want of jurisdiction.
