Dear Mr. Harris:

The petition for rehearing filed in this case focuses on the Tenth Circuit's recent decision in 303 Creative LLC v. Elenis, 6 F.4th 1160 (10th Cir. 2021), and asks the Court either to grant the petition for rehearing and petition for a writ of certiorari, or to hold the petition for rehearing pending the filing of a petition for writ of certiorari in 303 Creative. Reh'g Pet. at 13. The 303 Creative case involves the same tension between state public-accommodation laws and the First Amendment's Free Speech and Free Exercise Clauses. If the Court grants the 303 Creative petition and issues a merits opinion, that decision may warrant a GVR or summary reversal here.

In the petition for rehearing, counsel asserted that a petition for a writ of certiorari in 303 Creative "will be filed." Reh'g Pet. at 12 (emphasis omitted). This letter is to inform the Court that a petition for a writ of certiorari was filed in 303 Creative on September 24, 2021.
