We represent Respondents Ericsson Inc., Telefonaktiebolaget LM Ericsson, LSI Corporation, Avago Technologies U.S., Inc., and Gilead Sciences, Inc. in the above-captioned case. Pursuant to Rule 30.4, we are writing to request a 21-day extension of time to file Respondents' briefs in opposition to certiorari.

The petition for certiorari was filed and docketed on September 12, 2019. Respondents' briefs in opposition are currently due, on one extension, on November 14, 2019. If this second request for extension of time is granted, Respondents' briefs in opposition would be due on December 5, 2019.

Respondents respectfully request this extension due to the press of other matters, including, among others: a brief in opposition due on November 4 in *Amarin Pharma, Inc. v. Int'l Trade Comm'n*, 19-152; a response and reply brief due on November 8 in *Variety Stores, Inc. v. Walmart Inc.*, 19-1601, 19-1631 (4th Cir.); and a petition for certiorari due on December 29 in *Apple Inc. v. VirnetX Inc.*. This extension will ensure sufficient time to respond to the issues raised in the petition for certiorari in this case.

Counsel for petitioner does not object to this further extension of time for all respondents.
