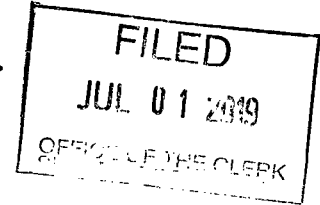


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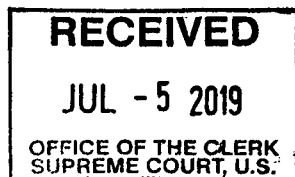
The petitioner asks leave to file the attached petition for a writ of certiorari without prepayment of costs and to proceed *in forma pauperis*.



My home was foreclosed because I ran out of money. Mr. O'Neill's collusive bidding at the Trustee's Sale significantly shrank the Surplus Funds. After living outside of the premises and having suffered from two unconstitutional and anti-statute Writs of Restitution, my monthly living expenses became very high. Because of the unjust criminal record, I do not have work income; and my only income is the monthly social security retirement benefits. I must keep borrowing money from my sister, which incurs an annual interest rate of 8.75%. I have owed her \$380,000+.
