To the Honorable Clarence Thomas, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States and Circuit Justice for the Eleventh Circuit:

Introduction

Pursuant to this Court's Rule 13.5, the Petitioner, Sean Frederik Franke, respectfully requests a sixty-day extension of time within which to file a petition for a writ of certiorari in this Court, to and including July 22, 2019.

Jurisdiction

The direct appeal opinion of the Florida First District Court of Appeal affirming the Petitioner's conviction was entered on February 20, 2019. Unless extended, the time within which to file a petition for a writ of certiorari would expire on May 21, 2019.

The jurisdiction of this Court is invoked under 28 U.S.C. § 1257. A copy of the opinion of the Florida First District Court of Appeal is included in the appendix to this motion.

Argument

The Petitioner will be seeking certiorari review of three issues concerning whether the Petitioner's Fifth and Fourteenth Amendment right to due process was violated: 1) the trial court's denial of the Petitioner's motion to suppress; 2) the trial court's refusal to limit the testimony of a State expert; and 3) the trial court's permission of the State to present an expert witness for the first time during rebuttal.

Unfortunately undersigned counsel's schedule requires him to seek an extension of time in this case. In particular, in the last six weeks, in addition to filing numerous briefs and pleadings, undersigned counsel has participated in four oral arguments before Florida appellate courts and one postconviction evidentiary hearing before Florida circuit courts – an unusually high number for undersigned counsel to attend within a six-week period.¹ Additionally, in the next three weeks, undersigned counsel will be out of his office attending three oral arguments scheduled before Florida appellate courts.²

Therefore, the Petitioner requests an extension of sixty days to file the petition for a writ of certiorari. No party will be prejudiced by the granting of a sixty-day extension in this case.

Accordingly, the Petitioner respectfully requests that an order be entered extending the time to petition for writ of certiorari by sixty days.
