PETITIONER LEE'S
MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE
PETITION FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI

COMES NOW, Petitioner, JEFFREY EUGENE LEE, ("Lee"), in proper person,^{1/} and hereby respectfully moves the Court, pursuant to Supreme Court RULE 13(5) and RULE 30(3-4), for entry of an Order granting him an extension of time of 60 DAYS within which to file his Petition for Writ of Certiorari. In support, Mr. Lee would make the following showing of good cause:

Mr. Lee fully desires to file a Petition for Writ of Certiorari. Lee affirms, however, that despite working diligently to complete his petition, circumstances beyond his control have served to prevent him from being able to do so by the present deadline. Lee's Petition for a Writ of Certiorari is currently due to be filed on or before April 20, 2019. This date is 90 days from the denial of Lee's petition for certiorari review by the Supreme Court of Florida on January 22, 2019. SEE: ATTACHMENT (Order).

^{1/} Lee, proceeding pro se, asks that the Court would liberally construe his pleadings. HAINES v. KERNER, 404 U.S. 519. 520 (1972).

Mr. Lee affirms that he requires additional time to complete his petition because his access to the law library at his institution has been severely restricted as a result of a number of institutional lock-downs and scheduling changes. The institution has also experienced recurring power outages over the past month in which he has been secured in his cell and unable to conduct legal research. These circumstances have prevented Lee from being able to timely and meaningfully complete his petition.


Mr. Lee is confident that, if the Court will grant the requested extension, he will be able to make a timely and meaningful filing of his petition. The extension will allow enough time for Lee to complete his legal research and sufficiently utilize the institutional law library. Lee affirms that this request is made solely in good faith and not intended for any purposes of undue delay.

CONCLUSION

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Mr. Lee respectfully prays this Court grants his motion for an extension of time of **60 DAYS** within which to file his Petition for Writ of Certiorari.
