8           ma'am. All right. The jury verdict is in

9           proper form and it is signed by Nicole

10          Stansbury, Foreperson. I'll ask the clerk

13 gentlemen, I want to thank you and everybody  
14 wants to thank you, the lawyers, we all  
15 appreciate your service. I know it's a very  
16 difficult thing to do. We really appreciate  
17 it. The good news is that all of you now  
18 have a two-year exemption from jury duty.  
19 So if you get a notice within the next two  
20 years, just tell them you served on this  
21 jury and you don't have to serve. And that  
22 goes for a civil jury, criminal jury or  
23 grand jury.

24 So, again, we really appreciate it.  
25 Thank you very much. You did a good job and  
26 you are free to go.

27 (THE JURY EXITS THE COURTROOM.)

28 THE COURT: All right. Anything anybody  
29 want to -- all right. We're going to set up  
30 the sentencing. All right. February the  
31 8th at 10:00 a.m.
