
**MR. THOMAS'S MOTION REQUESTING AN EXTENSION OF TIME
TO INCLUDE JULY 21, 2019 TO PETITION FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI**

Mr. Thomas requested reconsideration of the Eleventh Circuit's denial of his appeal. This reconsideration was denied February 27, 2019. Mr. Thomas has 90 days to file a petition for writ of certiorari with the Supreme Court, and is proceeding to do so as an incarcerated and pro se litigant. As such, he must overcome the many obstacles that are associated with prison life that hinder his ability to file his writ within the current 90 day limit. Therefore, Mr. Thomas requests an additional amount of time to include July 21, 2019 to properly file his petition with this Court.

Mr. Thomas is currently incarcerated at the FCI Coleman Low federal prison in Coleman, Florida. This prison is subject to numerous recalls and lockdowns due to staff shortages, staff parties, staff training (this week is staff appreciation week), weather, institutional counts, census counts, shakedowns, fights, security breaches, as well as things inmates are never told about.

All of these combine to limit Mr. Thomas's ability to access the education department where the 1 copy machine (available for 30 minutes, 3 times a day, 4 days a week), the 6 non-memory typewriters that have unbroken power cords, and the 12 law library research computers are all housed and shared by the 2,000 inmates housed here. These resources are required for Mr. Thomas to properly prepare his filing, and he requests this extension to include July 21, 2019 to overcome these known and unknown obstacles that hinder an otherwise earlier filing.




