A PORTION OF THE SAN JUAN ISLANDS SIT IN CANADA.

B: CANADIAN JURISDICTION, AND U.S. JURISDICTION ARE (2) SEPERATE + DISTINCT JURISDICTIONS.

C: PETITIONER DEMOS HAS "PROPERTY" ON THE SAN JUAN ISLANDS.

D: PETITIONER DEMOS GOES FISHING ON THE SAN JUAN ISLANDS.

E: PETITIONER'S HOME AWAY FROM HOME IS ON THE SAN JUAN ISLANDS.

F: THE SAN JUAN ISLANDS ARE A "BRITISH PROTECTORATE", WHICH WOULD ENTITLE PETITIONER DEMOS TO "DIPLOMATIC IMMUNITY", AS PETITIONER DEMOS IS AN "INHABITANT" OF THE SAN JUAN ISLANDS.

G: THE U.S. DOES NOT HAVE TO CONFER JURISDICTION BEFORE ONE CAN ASSERT "DIPLOMATIC IMMUNITY", 794 F.2d 806, 741 F.2d 12, 756 F.2d 91, 174 F.2d 496,

H: THE INSTANT PETITION FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI IS GOVERNED, CONTROLLED, AND REGULATED BY "THE LAW OF NATIONS", AND INTERNATIONAL LAW.

I: DEMOS INVOKES THE LAW OF RETURN, THE LAW OF THE SITUS, AND THE LAW OF THE DOMICILE, AS WELL AS THE LAW OF INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS.

J: WHILE LIVING ON THE SAN JUAN ISLANDS, DEMOS RESIDED ON THE SIDE THAT WAS CLAIMED BY CANADA AS HER POSSESSION, CANADA IS A PROCTOR, AND A PROTECTORATE OF GREAT BRITAIN.
