STATEMENT OF THE CASE

A. Demos is A STATE citizen formerly of VERMONT.

THE STATE OF VERMONT'S Northern Boundaries sit partially in the SOVEREIGN NATION OF CANADA, Petitioner Demos Resided in the NORTHERN PART OF VERMONT.

Due to the boundaries of the STATE of VERMONT one can be both a CANADIAN citizen, and a STATE citizen of VERMONT, or even a U.S. citizen, simultaneously.

B: Due to the fact that portions/sections of VERMONT sit in CANADA, Petitioner asserts that he is a PROTECTORATE of CANADA, and CANADA is a PROTECTORATE of GREAT BRITIAN.
