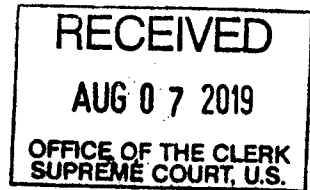

Motion for leave of Extention of Time
To File Writ of Certiorary

Now comes petitioner Franklin Elliott Benson pursuant to rule 13.5 with a showing of good cause, petitioner is requesting an extention of time to file his petition for a writ of certiorary.
