**MOTION FOR LEAVE TO PROCEED IN FORMA
PAUPERIS**

1. Pursuant to the instructions of the GUIDE FOR PROSPECTIVE INDIGENT PETITIONERS FOR WRITS OF CERTIORARI, I, Francisco Illarramendi, Defendant, acting Pro Se, request LEAVE to proceed *In Forma Pauperis* in filing my attached Petition for a Writ of Certiorari to the United States Court of Appeal for the Second Circuit (the "Petition").
2. Copies of the District Court Rulings subject of the Petition as well as the Summary Affirmation of the same are attached to the Petition.
3. I have previously been granted leave to proceed *In Forma Pauperis* in the appeal of the District Court decisions before the Second Circuit Court. I have previously filed a Petition for Certiorari pursuant to an earlier affirmation by the Second Circuit Court of Appeals of an interlocutory ruling in a parallel District Court case. The docket number of that petition is 18-5136. I also filed a separate Petition for Certiorari for the grant of Summary Judgment in that parallel case. The filing was initially rejected as untimely, but I am filing a Motion to file said Petition out of time. The instant case which this Petition refers to is separate and distinct from that case and this is a new Petition related to a different decision from the Second Circuit in a distinct, even if related, case.
4. As can be derived from the Petition, I am a defendant who was convicted and incarcerated in violation of the Constitution and Laws of the United States. This matter presents a clear issue of importance from a Constitutional viewpoint as the questions presented for the Court in the Petition affect the rights of countless incarcerated defendants throughout every Federal District and every State in the United States. In addition, the decisions at the Circuit and District levels directly violate several well-established precedents of this Supreme Court.

5. From a personal standpoint, I believe I am entitled to Certiorari Review and to a remand of the District Court ruling and the Circuit Court Summary Affirmance for several reasons which are mentioned in my Petition.
6. I am attaching a copy of the Court-provided financial affidavit form in support of this motion. For purposes of fully clarifying my financial position with respect to the foregoing motion, the following should be taken into account when evaluating the information in the attached affidavit:
 - a. In February of 2011 the District Court in an inextricably intertwined case (the “SEC Case”) imposed a Temporary Restraining Order (“TRO”)¹ freezing all of my assets. Subsequently, all of my assets were transferred into an escrow account under the control of the Court and a Court-appointed Receiver – the Plaintiff-Respondent to the Petition – and then were ultimately transferred to the SEC. I therefore have no effective assets to pay for any of the Court costs, fees or securities associated with the Petition. Moreover, my estimates of what was held in escrow are made without the benefit of updated information, as I have not received any formal information from

¹ As reflected in various portions of the case record this case is inextricably intertwined with the SEC Case, as defined in the Petition. This case is also inextricably intertwined with my unconstitutional criminal conviction and the Petition is partly based on the fact that the District Court has granted partial Summary Judgment relying on collateral estoppel from that conviction despite the fact it has before it a valid collateral attack of the conviction via a Habeas Petition which was filed prior to the filing of the Motion for Partial Summary Judgment by the Plaintiff. The District Court has thus effectively sequestered the judicial process by deciding the underlying case while remaining mute on the more important Habeas Petition. In particular, the TRO was a structural violation of my Constitutional right to Counsel of Choice in as defined by this Court in Luis v. United States, 136 S. Ct. 1083; 194 L. Ed. 2d 256; 2016 U.S. LEXIS 2272; 84 U.S.L.W. 4159; 26 Fla. L. Weekly Fed S 49. In the Habeas proceeding underlying the Criminal Matter, I am presently challenging my criminal conviction and sentence, partly because the TRO froze all of my assets, including those that were unequivocally untainted and made it impossible for me to hire counsel of choice to defend me in the underlying criminal matter as defined in the Petition. In the process, the TRO also left me effectively indigent, a condition that remains so to this day.

the Receiver regarding the amount of assets in escrow, their provenance, any interest income they may be deriving or otherwise.

- b. I have been incarcerated continuously since January 25, 2013. I am presently being held at the FCI Fairton Camp in Fairton, NJ ("Fairton").
- c. Under my present incarceration at Fairton, I receive approximately \$150 a month in salary from my work as Warehouse Clerk at Unicor Prison Industries and an additional loan allowance from my elderly parents totaling approximately \$75 a month, plus some sporadic, occasional help from friends and extended family.
- d. From these receipts, I am presently paying a quarterly amount under the inmate FRP of \$25 to help defray the costs of Court assessments.
- e. The remaining funds are used for all personal expenses including, phone (approximately \$60 a month), laundry (approximately \$20 a month), electronic communication and legal work (approximately \$110 a month), medicines (approximately \$30 a month) and food or personal hygiene items purchased through the Fairton Commissary Service (approximately \$100 a month).
- f. Although I was married at the time of my incarceration, my wife and I have since divorced. I never received a copy of the divorce decree and do not know whether or not I have any future financial obligations as a result thereof, particularly in the care of our two children. I list no income for my Spouse as she is not and cannot help to support me financially in any way at this time.
- g. Based on the facts described herein, I have assumed that the totality of any assets or income presently available to me for all of my expenses and obligations are limited to

those described in points b., c., and d. above; and have assumed that all my other assets are effectively equal to zero, which is the way I have listed them in the accompanying affidavit.

7. For all of the foregoing, I respectfully request that this Honorable Court allow me to pursue my Petition for Certiorari *In Forma Pauperis*.






