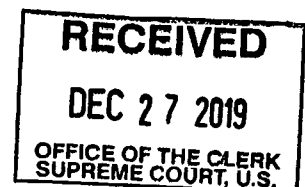
Dear Clerk of the United States Supreme Court,

We represent Respondent Trans Union, LLC ("Trans Union") in the above-referenced matter. Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 30.4, we seek a thirty (30) day extension of time in which to file a brief in opposition to the Petition for a Writ of Certiorari. The Petition was filed on December 9, 2019 and was placed on the Docket on December 16, 2019. Trans Union's brief is due on or before January 15, 2020.

The undersigned, lead counsel in this matter, has filed an Application for Admission to the United States Supreme Court and is currently awaiting admission so that we may appear on behalf of Trans Union. An extension of time is requested to allow the Application for Admission to be processed and for the undersigned to register for ECF filing.

Trans Union's counsel also has a number of other upcoming deadlines in this case. In addition to the Petition for Writ of Certiorari to this Court, Petitioners also filed a Motion To Stay All Proceedings in the Middle District of Pennsylvania in connection with the Court's Order awarding attorneys' fees to Trans Union and Petitioners filed an Appeal of the award of attorneys' fees to the Third Circuit. In light of these overlapping deadlines and considering the upcoming year-end holidays, Trans Union and its counsel believe a short extension is warranted.

Accordingly, we respectfully request a thirty (30) day extension of time, until February 14, 2020, to file Trans Union's brief in opposition to the Petition for a Writ of Certiorari.


