fake charge caused the Plaintiff loss of liberty.

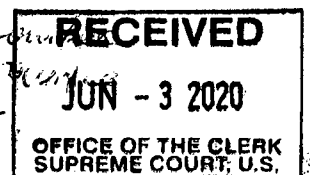
2. Such a purposeful action by a federal official is reprehensible, it is
