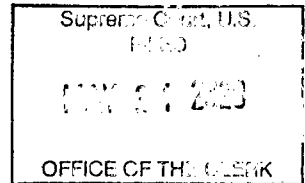


Respondent waives their right to answer the petition
