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
TO THE HONORABLE JUSTICE E. KAGAN:

DECLARATION OF JOSE PASSALACQUA

I Jose Passalacqua, declare:

1. I am incarcerated at the Correctional Training Facility in Soledad, California. My prison identification number is G-63887.
2. On September 7, 2011, I (the petitioner) filed in the United States District Court for the Central District of California a petition for writ of habeas corpus in the matter of, Jose Passalacqua v. Mike McDonal, Case No.: 2:12-cv-02430-AG-FFM, which was denied on September 30, 2014.
3. Petitioner timely appealed, but the Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit denied the appeal in 2016.
4. On July 30, 2018 petitioner filed in the District court a motion to reopen his original habeas corpus proceedings under Rule 60(b) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure.
5. On August 31, 2018, the district court summarily dismissed petitioner's Rule 60(b) motion. Petitioner timely appealed.
6. On October 25, 2019, the Ninth Circuit denied petitioner's request for a Certificate of Appealability, holding that petitioner did not satisfied Slack v. McDaniel, 529 U.S. 473, 484 (2000), (See Appendix A.)
7. Petitioner's petition for writ of certiorari is due in this Court on or about January 24, 2020, pursuant to Rule 13. Petitioner believes that he will need additional 60 days extension of time to and including Thursday, March 26, 2020 to conduct a full legal research about the complex issues involved in the case in order to prepare his petition for writ of certiorari for this Court consideration. He further contends that he have very limited physical access to the law library in the prison due


that the law library is experiencing short staffing since 2017, and the facility have not hired staff to fix the problem, which is the cause of the limited access to the law library.

8. This request for extension of time is based on Good Cause as described above, and is not made for the purposes of harassment or to cause undue delay, or any other improper reason.

9. For the foregoing reasons, petitioner respectfully request this Court to grant him 60-days extension of time to, and including Thursday, March 26, 2020, to file his petition for writ of certiorari for this Court consideration.
