UNOPPOSED SECOND APPLICATION FOR A 30-DAY EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE A PETITION FOR A WRIT OF CERTIORARI TO THE UNITED STATES COURT OF APPEALS FOR THE FIFTH CIRCUIT

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To the Honorable Samuel Alito, Associate Justice, and Circuit Justice for the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit:

- 1. This is a capital habeas corpus proceeding. On August 26, 2019, a panel of the Fifth Circuit issued an opinion affirming the final order of a district court denying habeas relief to Mr. Ibarra. See App. 1. Mr. Ibarra timely filed a petition for rehearing, which was denied on October 22, 2019. App. 2.
- 2. Mr. Ibarra had until January 20, 2020, to file a petition for a writ of certiorari seeking review of the Fifth Circuit's decision. *See* U.S.S.Ct.R. 13.1.
- 3. On January 8, 2020, Mr. Ibarra requested an extension of 30 days to file his petition for a writ of certiorari. The motion was granted on January 10, 2020, making his petition due February 19, 2020.
- 4. Under Rule 13.5 and Rule 30.3, this Court may extend the time for seeking certiorari for up to sixty (60) additional days. Mr. Ibarra presently requests a second extension of thirty (30) days, up to and including March 20, 2020. Counsel for the respondent does not oppose the requested extension of time.
- 5. While counsel has been able to begin the process of researching and preparing a petition for writ of certiorari, counsel will require additional time to do so, given their obligations in other cases.
- 6. The issues to be presented in Mr. Ibarra's capital case are significant, including the proper interpretation and application of the Sixth Amendment and this Court's decision in *Martinez v. Ryan*, 566 U.S. 1 (2012).

7. Counsel Russell Hunt, Jr., who has served as lead counsel in the case to date, has been obligated to move his office location at short notice due to a disagreement between his office's building owners, which has resulted in significant disruption in his practice. He is also preparing for the trial of a murder case which is scheduled to begin on March 9, 2020.

CONCLUSION

The application for extension of time should be granted, extending Mr. Ibarra's time to file a petition for writ of certiorari for thirty (30) days, until March 20, 2020.
