The People enact the Three Strikes Reform Act of 2012 to restore the original intent of California's Three Strikes Law imposing life sentences for dangerous criminals like rapist, murderers, and child molesters.

I was not convicted of Rape, Murder, or Child Molestation, therefore I should receive Relief under U.S. Constitution Fourteenth Amendment Equal Protection.

I should not have been treated any differently then non-violent Three Strike Offenders that received Relief under Proposition 36 Three Strikes Reform Act of 2012.

REASONS FOR GRANTING THE PETITION

Equal Protection dictates relief, the purpose of justice is equity. The dictum and stare decisis warrants a En Banc Review.
