Filing U.S. Supreme Court Documents by Mail

Rules

Rule 29 of the Supreme Court Rules sets forth the requirements for filing and serving documents. A Petition for Writ of Certiorari is deemed to be filed on the day it is received in the Clerk's Office in Washington, D.C. The Petition and copies must reach the Clerk's Office by the end of the last day of the period specified in the statute or rule that fixes the time limit, plus any extension granted by a Justice. A document sent by private delivery or courier service (*e.g.*, Federal Express) is timely filed only if it is actually received by the Clerk within the time permitted for filing.

However, a document is also timely filed if:

- (1) it is sent through the United States Postal Service,
- (2) first-class postage prepaid (including express or priority mail),
- (3) properly addressed to the Clerk of the Supreme Court, and
- (3) bears a postmark showing that the document was mailed on or before the due date.

NOTE: Commercial postage meter labels alone are not acceptable.

If the postmark is missing or not clearly legible, the Supreme Court may require a notarized statement or declaration setting out the date of deposit and stating that first-class postage has been prepaid.

Procedures

Anytime filing with the Supreme Court is accomplished by depositing the pleading in the U.S. mail, the following procedure is to be implemented. Deviation from these rules will constitute grounds for termination of employment.

- (1) One person will prepare the package for mailing.
- (2) A second person will verify that the label is correct
- (3) A photocopy of the box will be made.
- (4) A member of the CDA will personally take the package to the post office and insure that the package is postmarked & will have the photocopy of the box stamped with a postmark.
- (5) The form attached will be filled out with signatures of the appropriate persons.
